
OVF member 1995-2023

FALSE GARLIC ALERT


The abundant rain encouraged many, many weeds to sprout. One of the worst is False Garlic because it has white flowers with hundreds of windblown seeds and underground bulbils which look like tiny garlic bulbs. Dig deep to get it out of your plots and paths and put in the trash, not the shred pile. If you don't have the time to dig this up, at least cut the flowers off so it doesn't

have the chance to spread by its hundreds of seeds. Be sure to come back and dig it up.





HOW TO DEAL WITH FLEA BEETLES ON EGGPLANT



When you see many tiny shot-holes on your eggplant leaves, that's flea beetles, a tiny insect that loves to chew on eggplant. If nothing is done, the eggplant will not flourish and the harvest will be little to none. Water weekly with a weak fish emulsion solution, about 1 teaspoon to a quart of water, all over the plant. The goal is to get the plant growing strongly so that it is no longer bothered by the flea beetles. Row covers are an alternate means of protection. Use hoops to hold the cover above the plant, being sure to secure the covers to the ground.



You could also spray with Neem, paying particular attention to the underside of the leaves. Use Neem with caution, only spraying early or late in the day when few bees or other beneficial insects are active and when the temperature under 85 degrees. Remember that although Neem is an organic broad spectrum insecticide it doesn't discriminate between good and bad insects.
